<u>Sunday November 13 to early December, 2016, Montgomery's Inn Art Exhibition, 4709 Dundas</u> <u>Street West at Montgomery Road</u> The Avon Park subdivision on the northwest corner of The Queensway and Royal York Road was one of many "Victory Villages" sponsored by the Government of Canada to provide housing for veterans returning from World War II. *Certain Empty Houses* is an exhibition of drawings by Toronto-based artist Meaghan Hyckie.

<u>Thursday November 17, 2016 Etobicoke Historical Society Meeting, 7:00 for 7:30 pm,</u> <u>Montgomery's Inn, 4709 Dundas Street West at Montgomery Road</u> Speaker: Robert Fraser – "Reformer vs Reformer: James Price, David Gibson, and the Elections of 1851". In November 1851, the Reformers of Etobicoke Township held a hotly contested nomination meeting at Thomas Montgomery's Inn. Tonight's event will be held in the Ballroom – the very room where this historic meeting likely took place. Dr. Robert Fraser of the Dictionary of Canadian Biography will speak to the history and character of the individuals whose actions set in motion the political events of later years, including the formation of the new Dominion of Canada in 1867. Tamara Anson-Cartright, Program Manager at Heritage Preservation Services, City Planning, will be giving a presentation on "Heritage Conservation Districts in Toronto".

Wednesday December 7, 2016 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speakers: Sarah Hall and Craig Douglas on "In Partnership with the Sun: Stained-glass at St. Olave's". Craig Douglas is a member of St. Olave's Church in Swansea, and also a veteran variety entertainer and educator. Sarah Hall is a distinguished Canadian stained-glass artist, with many spectacular installations to her credit, in Toronto and elsewhere. Craig and Sarah will team up to present an illustrated talk about twelve of the glorious windows of St. Olave's Church that were specially designed and created for the parish church by the talented and renowned Canadian artist Yvonne Williams (1901-1997).

Wednesday February 1, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Daniel Laxer – "Music and Dance of the Fur Trade Era, 1760-1840". Daniel is a recent graduate from the history program at the University of Toronto. His talk will highlight his studies of Canada's music and dance centred around the fur-trade era. Daniel is also an accomplished fiddle player, and he will perform some traditional music associated with the time period.

Wednesday March 1, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Rona Arato – "The *Exodus 1947* – The Ship to Nowhere". Rona will be returning to Swansea with the story of the ship *Exodus 1947* (formerly the US packet steamer *SS President Warfield*). In July 1947, the ship sailed from France with 4,515 Jewish emigrants bound for Palestine, which was then part of the British Mandate. The Royal Navy prevented the passengers from landing in Haifa, and they were returned to camps in Europe. The public outcry over this incident factored into the events that led up to the creation of the State of Israel in 1948. A timely topic now when so many refugee issues are dominating the news!!

Wednesday April 5, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Peter Vronsky -- "The Battle of Ridgeway – The American Fenian Invasion and the 1866 Battle that Made Canada". Some 22,000 Canadians were mobilized in June 1866 to fight the Fenian invaders, and the resultant state of national emergency led to Canadian Confederation the following year.

Wednesday May 3, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Anne Dublin - "44 Hours on Strike!". At 10 a.m. on February 25, 1931, more than 500 women of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union (ILGWU) stopped their work, halted their machines, and walked out of factories across the city, initiating a lengthy and bitterly-fought strike in Toronto's garment industry. Anne will speak about the research and writing of this historical novel, which won the 2016 Canadian Jewish Literary Award.

Wednesday November 1, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Jack Gibney – "The Heyday, Demise, and Future of Sunnyside". Through historical photographs, humorous skits, and dramatizations, a troupe from the Sunnyside Historical Society will give a presentation covering noteworthy events from various time periods, as well as the unique architecture of the Sunnyside area of Toronto.

Wednesday December 6, 2017 SHS Meeting, 7:15 for 7:30 pm, Swansea Town Hall Speaker: Bianca Lakoseljac. Bianca is a High Park resident and author, who will speak to us about her latest novel "Stone Woman", the story of a family of five women whose lives are bound by a Vietnam War draft dodger from the hippie "daze" of Toronto. The novel begins in 1967 during the Centennial Art Symposium in High Park, it relives the creation of the sculptures (of which five still remain in the park), and it draws the reader into the hippie subculture centred in the Yorkville district. The novel is brought to the present time through the lives of the daughters of the women from the 60s. By discovering their family secrets – while unraveling the mystery of stolen art that occurred during the 1967 Symposium – the daughters find ways of handling their own life crises. The novel ends in 2017, with imagined Sesquicentennial celebrations in Toronto.
