Ontario Historical Society: This year, our parent organization, the **Ontario Historical Society**, is celebrating its 125th anniversary and the 100th anniversary of the construction of its current headquarters, the historic John McKenzie House in North York. Since 1899, the OHS has been publishing a scholarly journal "Ontario History". As of April, 2013, 325 issues had been published, with well over 2,000 articles written by some of the province's greatest historians. To mark the two anniversaries, the OHS has undertaken an ambitious project to digitize all past and future issues of *Ontario History* and make this vast treasure trove of historical information available on-line. A drive has been launched to raise \$125,000 with the theme: "The Ontario Historical Society: Preserving 125 years – Our legacy for the Next 125". Wednesday, February 5th, 2014 Meeting: SPEAKER: Eva Stachniak, discussing Catherine the Great of Russia. Behind every great ruler lies a betrayal.
