

Happy New Year!! As we head into 2015, I am pleased to report that we have an interesting line-up of speakers confirmed for the next several months. All of our events are always open to members and visitors alike. In addition to our monthly meetings, we are making tentative plans to conduct historic walking tours in the Swansea area. Also, various local organizations are planning events to commemorate the 400th anniversary of Étienne Brûlé's 1615 journey down the "Toronto Carrying Place" portage route. In our school days, we learned that Brûlé was the first European to set foot in the Swansea area and the first to view Lake Ontario. A famous sketch by C. W. Jefferys shows "Étienne Brûlé at the Mouth of the Humber", presumably at a point on the height of land near today's Riverside Drive in Swansea.

In Sympathy We were deeply saddened to learn that Dr. Laurie Morgan passed away on Friday, January 2, 2015, in his 94th year. Laurie is survived by his wife Muriel, their five children, Bruce, Scott, Heather, Brenda, and Kathryn, and their grandchildren and great-grandchildren, as well as many nieces and nephews. Laurie tended to many Swansea residents with care and compassion in his medical practice. Initially, he was the only general practitioner in Swansea, and he not only made house calls, but he also participated in the delivery of many Swansea-ites. For many years, both Laurie and Muriel served with distinction on the Board of Directors of the Swansea Historical Society. Laurie arranged for the speakers for the Society's monthly meetings and Muriel provided the refreshments. At one of our meetings, Laurie was the featured speaker, as he showed photographs from a walk he had taken along the route of the historic Belt Line Railway. In 2012, Laurie and Muriel both received 20-year Volunteer Service Awards from the Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration, recognizing their long and dedicated service to our Society. In 2011, some of us had the pleasure of meeting the extended Morgan family, as Laurie and Muriel both celebrated their 90th birthdays. (They were born just two weeks apart). On September 22, 2013, about 150 family and friends gathered at the Church of the Messiah as Laurie and Muriel renewed their marriage vows while celebrating their 70th Anniversary together. Shortly before Christmas, I had a pleasant chat with Laurie, never imagining it would be the last opportunity. He will be truly missed!! Laurie was a sincerely religious man, and he looked forward to his passing as a new beginning. On Tuesday, January 6, 2015, Reverend Tay Moss of the Church of the Messiah conducted Laurie's funeral service at Turner & Porter on Bloor Street and his interment at Park Lawn Cemetery. We extend our heartfelt condolences to Muriel and her extended family and friends.

In Sympathy We were saddened to learn that SHS member Flo Calwell passed away on Saturday, January 10, 2015, with her family surrounding her. Flo had been living at the Bonham Residences next door to the Town Hall, and she enjoyed attending the Society's monthly meetings whenever her health permitted. Will O'Hara's topic will be Life in West Toronto before European Contact. It will be based on research on the Wendat (Huron) people who lived in this area for hundreds of years, long before they were displaced by their eternal enemy, the Iroquois from northern New York State. The story is centred around what is now Baby Point. It covers the Toronto Islands and the Carrying Place Trail to Georgian Bay.
