The Swansea Historical Society will also be participating in the 100th Anniversary Celebration in High Park on Sunday March 23 and the Indoor Garage Sale at Swansea Town Hall on Sunday March 30. In addition, we are tentatively planning historical walking tours for Saturday May 7 and Saturday June 1. All of our events are always open to members and non-members alike. We hope to see you there.

The 30 people who braved the storm and attended the February SHS meeting viewed a sample of the beautiful art work David Crighton has created to commemorate the March 23 High Park event. We have invited David to come to the March 5th SHS meeting with his High Park prints for sale (\$75 plus tax).

At the end of January, 2014, Dr. Ellen Scheinberg of "Heritage Professionals" submitted her draft report outlining her assessment of the current state of the Society's Archives, and her recommendations for moving the Archives forward. The next steps will be for the Archives Team and the Executive to review the recommendations, determine the feasibility and affordability of the recommended actions, and assign priorities to the follow-up activities.

Swansea Town Hall: For many years, the historic Swansea Town Hall (STH) has been the focal point of our Society's activities. We encourage our members to become engaged in the operation and preservation of this important community resource. The Annual General Meeting of the Swansea Town Hall and the STH Association, scheduled for 7:30 pm on Thursday, February 20, 2014, will be an opportunity to learn more about the workings of the Town Hall. Proposed Heritage Conservation District for Bloor West

Village: Representatives from 4 local residents' associations have been spearheading an initiative to have the Bloor West Village shopping area designated as a Heritage Conservation District (HCD). The establishment of a HCD confirms that an area possesses significant and unique cultural and architectural attributes that are worthy of preservation, and it creates legal restrictions aimed at preventing unsympathetic development. The area under consideration consists of the properties on the north and south sides of Bloor Street West, from the Humber River to High Park. The process of creating a HCD is lengthy, time-consuming, and costly. The residents' organizations have recently produced a draft Nomination Document, which we have had the privilege of reviewing. We wish them well in their endeavour.

That being said, the next meeting of the **Etobicoke-York Preservation Panel** will be discussing the Bloor West Heritage District. It will be held on Monday March 3 at the Swansea Town Hall. Please share this date and come out to show your support!

<u>Sunday afternoon, March 23, 2014</u>: "100th Anniversary Celebration of the Howard Memorial Gates" at the Parkside Drive entrance to High Park. Parade starts at 2 pm – other event times to be confirmed. This promises to be an exciting and memorable event. If you would like to assist at the Society's information table, please let us know.

The celebration will be hosted by the staff of Colborne Lodge (the historic home of John and Jemima Howard) and Councillor Sarah Doucette, with the support of many community groups.
