

## Ashbridge's Bay – The Natural and Human History of a Wetland

By the time you read this Newsletter, work will be winding down on the current phase of the Society's "Archives Improvement" project. With funding in the form of a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, we have purchased computer equipment and software, received archives training, engaged the services of a professional archives consultant, selected and installed specialized archiving software, and started the lengthy process of scanning material in the Society's collection and storing the digitized files on the Society's computer equipment. It has been a long and arduous journey. I wish to extend a sincere thank-you to the Ontario Trillium Foundation for their ongoing support, and to all of those Society members who have contributed their time and talents.

For a number of years, our room in the Ravine Level of the Swansea Town Hall has been known as the William Small Memorial Archives Room. In fact, the room contains much more than an Archive. Your Society has also accumulated an extensive collection of historical artifacts, photographs, memorabilia, publications, etc. We now feel it is more appropriate to refer to our operation as the "Swansea Historical Resource Centre / Archive", while maintaining the William Small Memorial designation, in memory of the late Swansea Public School teacher who served as the Society's historian for many years. At the same time, in keeping with the Town Hall's preferred approach to identifying rooms within the building, the room itself has been tentatively named "The Swansea Room".

Starting in February 2016, we have resumed our regular schedule of having the Resource Centre / Archive open to our members and the general public on most Wednesday afternoons between 3:30 pm and 7:30 pm. If you have not visited the room recently, we invite you to come down and have a look. However, since we may not be open every Wednesday, we recommend that you telephone 647-859-3901 to verify that someone will be there to receive you. Visits can also be arranged by appointment at other times.
