Wednesday May 7th, 2014, Meeting SPEAKER: Rev. Dr. Karen Dimock is the pastor at Morningside-High Park Presbyterian Church. Rev. Dimock will talk about Morningside-High Park's long-time role in the Swansea community, and recent developments bringing the Church into the 21st century, including the installation of solar panels, and all the behind-the-scenes activities that were required to bring that initiative to fruition.



Wednesday October 1st, 2014, Meeting SPEAKER: Thelma Wheatley on "Scandal in Early 1900s Swansea/High Park: Eugenics, Class, Abortion, and the Institutionalization of the 'Feeble-Minded'". Thelma's talk will focus on the institution in Orillia, then called the Asylum for Idiots and Feeble-Minded. In the early 1900s, Toronto was rocked by the scandal of Ruth Dembner, a young woman from a wealthy Swansea/High Park family who lived in the High Park area and had a secret abortion from which she died.

The October 1 meeting will also include the Annual General Meeting of the Swansea Historical Society and election of Board members to serve in 2014-2015.



Wednesday November 5th, 2014, Meeting SPEAKER: Popular speaker Linda Grandfield will return to Swansea to address a topic related to Remembrance Day and the 100th anniversary of the Declaration of War in 1914. Details to be determined.



Wednesday December 3rd, 2014, Meeting SPEAKER: Nate Hendley on the story of Edwin Alonzo Boyd, the "gentleman bank robber" and leader of the notorious "Boyd Gang" which made front-page news in Toronto in the 1950s. The gang's exploits included a string of bank robberies, the murder of a Toronto police officer, and two daring escapes from Toronto's Don Jail. Two members of the gang were the last persons to be hanged in the Don Jail.

<u>Heritage Toronto/Swansea Historical Society Annual Walk on Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup>-</u> <u>"Along the Boardwalk of Humber Bay"</u> Now lined with quiet parks and recreation facilities, the waterfront around Humber Bay was once home to dance halls, the Sunnyside Amusement Park, and a wooden boardwalk where the annual 'Easter Parade' was held. Hear about this area's fascinating past on this walk along the shore east of the Humber River. Start time is 1:30pm and participants can meet at the parkette to the east of the Palais Royale, accessible from the pedestrian bridge at Queen and Roncesvalles.
