

Saturday, September 21st, 2013: Madeleine McDowell and Bob Roden will lead a historic walk (in costume), re-enacting a portion of Lieutenant-Governor Simcoe's 1793 expedition up the Toronto Carrying Place. The walk will start at 9:30 am at the parking lot on the south side of the Petro Canada station, located at #8 South Kingsway, and then head north, following as closely as possible the historic First Nations portage route. Guests are welcome to join us for all or part of the walk.

Wednesday, October 2nd Meeting: Join us for our annual general meeting, where we will elect our executive for the upcoming year. Following the business portion of the meeting, speaker Paul Huntley will present "City Dairy Toronto: A Yellow Wagon on Every Street". Wednesday, November 6th Meeting: SPEAKER: Sandra Joyce: "The Street Arab – The Story of a British Home Child". The Street Arab is a powerful novel about a Scottish boy whose family is torn apart by World War I. Robbie returns home one day to find his family missing and suffers a horrific accident. With strength and determination, he forges ahead and is sent, along with countless other British Home Children, to Canada to begin a new life. The Street Arab, written almost a century later, pays homage to the children involved in one of Canada's largest immigration schemes. It is estimated that ten percent of Canadians are British Home Child descendants.

Wednesday, December 4th Meeting: SPEAKER: Alan Skeoch - broadcaster, author, and award-winning history teacher. Alan has deep roots in the west end of Toronto, having attended Runnymede Public School, Humberside Collegiate, and the University of Toronto, and then having gone on to teach at Parkdale Collegiate for 33 years. He wil draw upon his personal experience to discuss the question, "Why Teach History?" -- "Transferring Wisdom, and Life's Lessons Obtained Through Learning and Teaching History".
